Sculptural Illumination Debuts Stateside

Unveiled at EuroLuce during Milan's Salone del Mobile, Lucifer Lighting's new luminaire—designed with Gensler—merges Art Deco elegance, cutting-edge technology, and sustainable craft.

At this year's EuroLuce during Milan's Salone del Mobile, one fixture in particular seemed to draw a crowd like moths to a flame. Enter Stellaris, the latest release from San Antonio-based Lucifer Lighting. Designed in collaboration with Gensler's New York team, the 30-inch pendant conceals advanced waveguide technology behind a deceptively simple, sculptural shell. When switched off, the piece reads as clear glass. Once illuminated, it glows opaquely, referencing the works of Le Corbusier and René Lalique. "Stellaris is a sculptural piece that doesn't just illuminate a space—it defines it," says Gilbert Mathews, CEO and founder of the multigenerational brand, which has long lit projects for Apple, SFMOMA, and Chanel. Crafted in the United States from recycled steel and aluminum, each made-to-order luminaire underscores Lucifer's continued commitment to sustainability, artistry, and architectural precision. luciferlighting.com
